The Building

Chater Infant School opened in 1989, replacing the old Chater School building which accommodated pupils up to the age of 11.

Chater Infant School is an ethnically rich school which caters for Infant and Nursery aged children.

The classrooms offer stimulating, well presented teaching and learning environments.

The school has a very wellresourced library with regularly replenished reading books to support individual reading both at home and school.

Each class is equipped with an interactive screen, visualiser and access to laptops, programmable equipment and other handheld devices.

The school grounds provide an attractive outdoor learning area and a beautifully designed garden. We have a designated outdoor learning area for the children in the Nursery and Reception classes

Watford Borough Council has funded a separate play area with climbing apparatus and swings which our children use during the school day. This is open to the public after school.

The Curriculum

At Chater Infant School we are committed to ensuring that each child receives high quality teaching.

We believe that all children should enjoy learning and that each child must be encouraged to be a life-long learner and have an equal opportunity to achieve their maximum learning potential.

We offer a curriculum which is broad and balanced and which:

- Promotes the spiritual, moral, cultural, mental and physical development of pupils at the school and in society
- Prepares pupils at the school for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of later life
- Comprises all learning and other experiences that Chater Infant School plans for its pupils.

These include opportunities for real-life experiences, such as; exploring the great outdoors, cooking, fundraising, observing how animals and plants grow and change over-time, experiencing live performances and learning through scientific investigations.

British Values

At Chater Infant School the curriculum actively promotes the fundamental British Values as outlined by both Ofsted and the Department for Education.

The British Values have been broken down and matched across the curriculum. In some instances, the British Values compliment and reinforce our values, the Rights Respecting School Agenda and International School Award values.

Growth Mind Set (GMS)

We believe that children learn best when they have a growth mindset (GMS) as opposed to a fixed mind set. We encourage a growth mindset across all areas of the curriculum.

We encourage and nurture our children to develop resilience through a focus on:

- · Being resilient
- · Being independent
- Persevering and being perceptive about themselves and others
- Embracing challenges, learning from their mistakes and taking risks with their learning
- Being curious, inquisitive and asking questions

- Working hard both independently and with others
- Reflecting and improving their learning skills.

Teaching and Learning

Teachers plan collaboratively to ensure that the children receive a broad, balanced and progressive curriculum of the highest quality.

Nursery & Reception

When children are in the Nursery and Reception classes, they are taught from the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum.

This is organised into seven areas of learning:

- Personal, Social & Emotional Development
- Communication & Language
- Physical Development
- Literacy
- Maths
- Understanding the World
- Expressive Arts & Design.



Year 1 and Year 2

Work is based on the National Curriculum and also the needs and interests of the children. Teachers ensure that all children have equal and equitable opportunities to enjoy all areas of the curriculum, regardless of their race, gender, disability, or social background.

Personal, Social and Health Education

The well-being of each child is very important and this is considered in all aspects of school life.

Planning, support and engagement with parents and carers reinforces our commitment to ensure each and every child thrives at Chater Infant School.

We fully utilise any opportunities to improve each child's physical and mental well-being.

P.E.

We are committed to healthy living and exercise and this is reflected in our curriculum and extra-curricular activities.

Religious Education

The school teaches Religious Education (R.E.) in line with the Hertfordshire R.E. Syllabus. All faiths practised by children in the school are celebrated during assemblies

School Visits

A wide range of visits and visitors are arranged to ensure children have a wealth of first hand experiences.

School Clubs


There is a range of extra curricular activities which take place during lunch times and after school, depending on the time of year.

Home Learning

All children are expected to read to an adult at home on a regular basis. Home learning activities are set each week in all year groups. Termly topic plans are available on the school website, so parents are aware of their child's learning and can support learning at home.

Rights Respecting School Agenda Award (UNICEF)



As a multi-cultural and diverse school community, it is important to celebrate and learn about countries and different cultures around the globe. As a school, we have achieved the British Council's Award for International Schools.

The 'international' curriculum supports our children to have a better understanding of the worldaround them. It enables our school to develop a curriculum that celebrates who they are and where they are from and also develop socially and culturally.

The 'international' activities are interwoven into our topics so there is a clear purpose for learning in a range of subjects. Alongside the activities, the award gives our children the opportunity to develop global links with other schools around the world.

Our links with an international school may be in the form of completing joint projects, class email, sending cards, pictures and writing letters to learn more about each other.

As well as activities within the classroom, our international school activities are supported through whole school events and assemblies.

Chater Infant School has been awarded silver status by UNICEF in recognition of our work promoting children's rights.

The Key Stage One curriculum embraces our children's rights in our learning in lessons (particularly in PSHE and Religious Education) and through assemblies.

We teach our children that everybody has these rights and that everybody should be treated equally and fairly. It is important to recognise that everybody should respect the rights of other people.

We have a responsibility to ensure that our pupils learn how to respect and value themselves to create a safe and happy school community.

The UNICEF articles underpin everything that we learn about across the school. It supports our children to develop the right skills to prepare them to become responsible young citizens.

International Schools Award:

Chater Infant School has received an Arts Mark from Arts Council England which recognises how well the arts have been embedded across our Key Stage One curriculum.



Equality and equity for all our children

At Chater we are committed to ensuring that every child, whatever their background or their circumstances, has the support needed to ensure they are safe, healthy, enjoy and achieve, make a positive contribution to society and work towards economic well-being in the future.

Working with external Agencies

We work closely with other organisations involved in providing services for children, for example, the health services, children's services, other schools, the police and voluntary groups.

We share information and work together to protect children and young people from harm and help them achieve their potential and goals.

Behaviour

- Every child has the right to be safe

Effective learning takes place in a caring, well-ordered and disciplined environment.

We recongnise that all behaviour is communication. Any behaviour that interrupts learning will be addressed quickly and robustly. The children are always encouraged to be polite and well behaved. Children are encouraged to behave well because that is what is expected, rather than through fear of punishment or for a reward.

However, if a child persistently misbehaves, there are procedures to deal with this, which are set down in the school Behaviour Policy. If we are concerned about a child's behaviour, we inform the parents. We also like to know if parents have noticed any changes in their child'sbehaviour at home or have any other concerns.
