Job Purpose:	To lead and develop the provision of PSHE and Citizenship education within the school, ensuring a high-quality curriculum that meets statutory requirements and prepares students for life beyond school. The post holder will be responsible for delivering engaging lessons, supporting staff in delivering PSHE and Citizenship, and promoting student well-being and personal development. This includes Relationships and Sex Education.

	<ul> <li>Provide strategic leadership for PSHE and Citizenship, ensuring the curriculum is engaging, inclusive, and aligned with national guidelines and school priorities.</li> <li>Develop and implement schemes of learning that support students' social, emotional, and personal development.</li> <li>Monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of the curriculum and make improvements where necessary.</li> <li>Lead and support a team of teachers in delivering inclusive and high-quality lessons, providing coaching and professional development opportunities.</li> <li>Stay up to date with relevant legislation, policies, and best practices to ensure compliance with the national curriculum and DfE guidance and innovation in the subject area.</li> <li>Teaching and Learning</li> <li>Plan and deliver high-quality PSHE and Citizenship lessons that engage and challenge students.</li> <li>Ensure teaching approaches are inclusive and promote diversity, equality, and respect.</li> <li>Develop effective assessment strategies to measure student progress and impact.</li> <li>Support cross-curricular initiatives to embed PSHE and Citizenship across the wider school curriculum.</li> <li>Lead assemblies, workshops, and enrichment activities that enhance students' understanding of key themes.</li> </ul>

- Provide training and support to colleagues delivering PSHE and Citizenship, ensuring consistency and confidence in delivery.
- Lead CPD sessions related to PSHE and Citizenship best practices.
- Collaborate with other departments to embed PSHE and Citizenship themes across the wider curriculum.

### **Strategic Development**

In addition to the duties above, the post holder may take
responsibility for an additional whole-school strategic responsibility
that will support student outcomes or well-being. The focus of this
additional responsibility will be at the discretion of the line manager
and may be subject to change over time
