How will apprentices be assessed?

- Submission of a portfolio of evidence that is collated with written assignments, case studies, and presentations
- Practical observations
- Professional discussion
- Demonstration of competence during an End Point Assessment.

What are the entry requirements?

Elements of this apprenticeship do require a reasonably high level of ability in English and Maths and one would typically expect an apprentice to have already achieved the following grades.

- Grade C or above or 4/5 (New Grading) At GCSE In Maths
- Grade C or above or 4/5 (New Grading) At GCSE In English

How is this course delivered?

- A curriculum model that works for schools has been created that includes a blended experience of live teaching sessions, online master classes, and practical research tasks.
- Virtual training days led by qualified teachers and other professionals to support strategies within the classroom and for young people with additional needs.
- Bespoke curriculum models can be tailored to the needs of your school.

How long does this apprenticeship course take to complete?

Typically the course lasts between 13 to 15 months including one month for End Point Assessment (EPA).

How much does the apprenticeship cost?

Utilise the school Apprenticeship Levy* to fully fund the apprenticeship.
